It has been under demonstration for the past few weeks and the many railroad officials who have ridden on it seem to be favorably impressed.

The car provides a new combination of great strength with extremely light weight owing to its shot-welded stainless steel construction, a new measure of operating economy and a degree of riding comfort and silence heretofore unattainable. For example, the results so far obtained indicate an operating cost of approximately $10\frac{3}{4}$ % per mile, including interest on investment, depreciation, insurance, repairs, replacements, fuel and lubricating oil and everything excepting the wages of the operator. This is with Diesel power.

It seems to us that this affords the railroads an excellent opportunity for profitable investment where the requirements on either main, branch or connecting lines, are such that make it desirable to recapture passenger travel that may have been lost to road vehicles or else the maintenance or inauguration of a service that might otherwise be unprofitable. Not the least of its advantages is the extent to which it seems to have captured the fancy of the riding public and this too, we believe, could be capitalized in a substantial way.
